Employment 5 TAs for afternoon interventions to Y1-Y6	£61,500	Pupil premium children in all cohorts tend to have very low starting points and gaps between disadvantaged and non-disadvantaged children has widened in some cohorts.  School has employed our TAs to work during afternoons across Y1-Y6 to help diminish the difference in reading, writing & maths. Catch up sessions and planned and interventions monitored		
Employment of a TA to support specific SEND children	£2120	TA spends one morning per week delivering bespoke interventions for SEND children many of whom are also disadvantaged. The TA has a range of qualifications in interventions such as relax kids and Lego therapy		
Purchase of SLA with speech therapist	£1,800	A school based therapist works with identified children to improve speech and language. The impact of this work is seen through S&L strand of early years and training for EY staff has also been a benefit so daily intervention can be given.		
Music service contribution to pay for FSM tuition	£382	A major barrier to learning is parents' ability to pay for extracurricular activities & encouragement to try a wider range of activities. School pays for music tuition- this raises confidence, enthusiasm for learning & wider opportunities		
Curriculum enhancement	£7000	Providing opportunities for children across school to have a range of new experiences. This can include residential trips, school trips and visits to school. We believe that this has a huge impact on writing and vocabulary.

Licence for Reading plus programme for Year 6	£1000	Online reading programme used in Y6 and in Y5 in the summer term to improve reading speeds and comprehension. This provides access to high quality texts for disadvantaged children.
