

## South Hetton Primary School Planned Sports Premium Funding 2021-2022

The award for South Hetton this year will be **£17,690**

Below is a breakdown of how the funding for 2021/2022 will be spent.

We have been looking at the key indicators:

- Engaging all pupils in at least 30 minutes of physical activity a day.
- Raising the profile of PESSPA (Physical Education School Sport and Physical Activity) across the whole school.
- Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in delivering High quality PE and Sport.
- Broader experience in a range of sports for all children.
- Increased participation in competitive sport.

Other ways in which we work towards the key indicators not covered by Sport Premium.

- Children encouraged to Bike and walk to school. High percentage of children do this.
- Taking part in the 'Home Walk' project for Years 3,4 and 5.
- Working with the SGO (school Games Organiser) to create content for Durham Sport with was featured on their 'You Tube' channel and on Tyne and Wear TV.
- Worked with the SGO on learning to play Quiddich. (Equipment loaned to school during the summer term).
- Worked with SGO on participating with the Durham Sport 'Friendly Games'. We were paired with another school and taught each other games – focus on those with low self-esteem.
- Opportunities to be active during breaktimes and breakfast club.
- School grounds and static equipment are open for use by the community after school.
- Opportunities taken to work with coaches, clubs and National Governing Bodies to increase opportunities and sign post children to clubs.
- Annual Sporting awards to keep the profile of school sport high.
- Dedicated committee in the Pupil Parliament to deal with PESSPA.
- Dedicated sport page on the South Hetton Herald.
- Regular updates on School Twitter/School Website.
