Below is a breakdown of how the funding for 2024/2025 will be spent.

We have been looking at the key indicators:

1. **Staff knowledge and skills:** Increase the confidence, knowledge, and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport.
2. **Pupil engagement:** Increase the engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity
3. **School profile:** Raise the profile of PE and sport across the school
4. **Physical activity range:** Broaden the range of physical activities and sports for all pupils
5. **Competitive sport participation:** Increase participation in competitive sport

There are also several inclusive events we have access to. The SSP run several high quality after school clubs across the year. Inter school competition provides a stimulus for Intra School House competitions such as Cross Country.

Other ways in which we work towards the key indicators not covered by Sport Premium.

- Children encouraged to Bike and walk to school. High percentage of children do this. Bikeability courses run Y6, Y5 and Y4.



- Opportunities to be active during breaktimes and breakfast club and Pupil Parliament consulted about improvements to be made to the school yard.
- Opportunities taken to work with coaches, clubs and National Governing Bodies to increase opportunities and sign post children to clubs.
- Annual Sporting awards to keep the profile of school sport high.
- Dedicated committee in the Pupil Parliament to deal with PESSPA.
- Regular updates on School Facebook and School Website.
- Girls football day
- National School Sports Week including our Annual Sports Day
- Charity Sponsored Walk in aid of the Darby-Rimmer Foundation
- Part of 'Chance to Shine' initiative to deliver cricket coaching sessions through Durham Cricket in 23/24 and 24/25
- Ongoing funding for 'Opening School Facilities Funding'. Late after school clubs now running as part of this scheme. Completed in Spring 25.
- Supporting Durham Cricket to host coaching interviews for new employees.
